







## CDC defines health disparities as


- Preventable differences

- Experienced by <u>socially</u> <u>disadvantaged populations</u>

## Healthy People 2020 defines health disparities as

- Particular type of health difference
- Closely <u>linked</u> with social, economic, and/or environmental <u>disadvantage</u>
